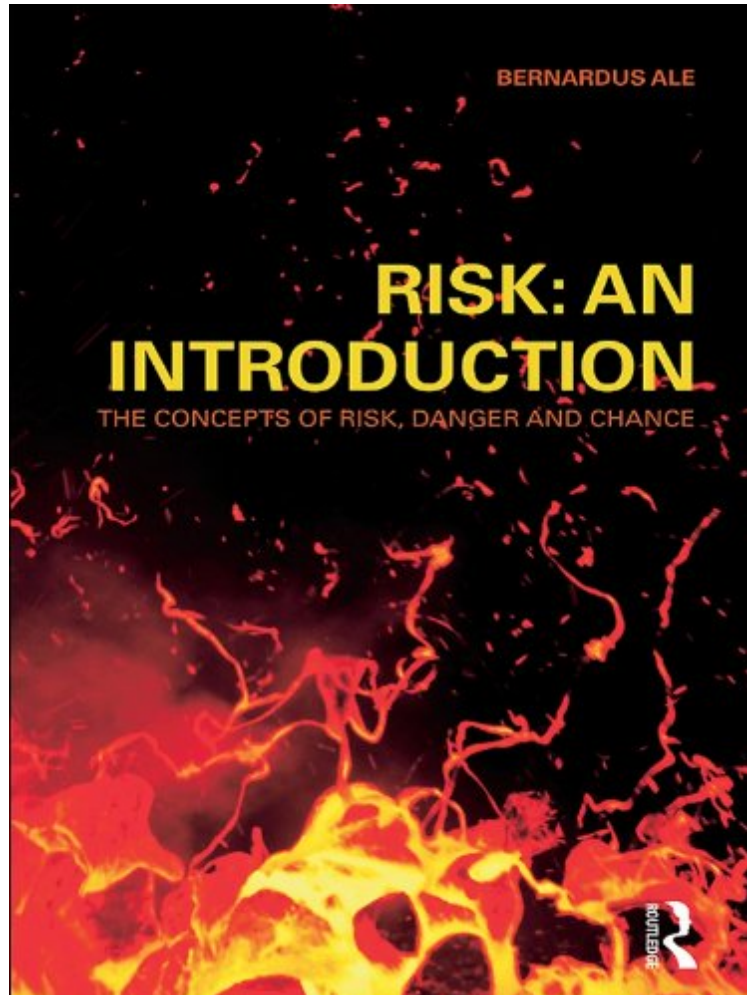

At times it presents a clear presentatio of different aspects of risk, e.g. when discussing whether risk originates from uncertainty in "when" (we know accidents happen, and what the outcome will be, but we dont know when) or in "what" (we know something is happening but dont know where it ends).
